COMPLAINT

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2. Defendant Kaiser Permanente Ventures, LLC, is a Delaware Corporation. At all times material to this Complaint, said Defendant has conducted business in California. Kaiser's agent for service of process is CSC, 2711 Centerville Rd, Suite 400, Wilmington, DE 19808.

3. Plaintiff is informed and believes and thereon alleges that the fictitiously-named Defendants sued herein as Does 1 through 20 inclusive, and each of them, are in some manner responsible for the occurrences, acts, and omissions alleged herein and that Plaintiff's damages were proximately caused by their conduct. The true names and capacities of such fictitiously-named Doe Defendants, whether individual, corporate, partnership, associate or otherwise, are presently unknown to Plaintiff, and Plaintiff will seek leave of the Court to amend this Complaint to assert the true names and capacities of such fictitiously-named Defendants when the same have been ascertained. For convenience, each reference to the named Defendant herein shall also refer to Does 1 through 20, inclusive.

4. Plaintiff is informed and believes and thereon alleges that in committing certain acts herein as alleged, some or all of the Defendants herein named were acting as the agents, joint ventures, partners, representatives, subsidiaries, affiliates and/or employees of some or all of the other Defendants, and that some or all of the conduct of such Defendants, as complained of herein, was within the course and scope of such relationship.

5. Pursuant to Article VI, Section 10 of the California Constitution, subject matter jurisdiction is proper in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles.

6. Pursuant to Section 395 of the California Code of Civil Procedure, venue is proper in the Superior Court of California for the County of Los Angeles, because this is where Defendant resides.

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FACTUAL BACKGROUND

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7. Defendant employed Plaintiff.

8. Plaintiff was injured and suffered a disability.

9. Defendant's employee, a physician, treated Plaintiff and effected her medical leave.

10. Defendant terminated Plaintiff's employment the next day on the basis of Plaintiff's disability and her exercising her right to medical leave before Plaintiff completed the medical leave.

11. Despite Defendant's knowledge of Plaintiff's disability, Defendant did not engage in the interactive process to determine a reasonable accommodation for Plaintiff's disability.

12. Plaintiff has received a Right to Sue letter from the California Department of Fair Housing and Employment and has thus exhausted all necessary administrative remedies.

13. As a proximate result of the wrongful acts of Defendants, Plaintiff has suffered and continues to suffer economic damages, emotional distress, humiliation, mental anguish and embarrassment.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION
(Disability Discrimination in Violation of FEHA)
(Against All Defendants)

14. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference all paragraphs of this Complaint as though fully set forth herein.

15. Under FEHA, it is unlawful for an employer to discriminate on the basis of disability.

16. Defendant terminated Plaintiff's employment on the basis of her disability.

17. As a proximate result of the wrongful conduct of Defendant, Plaintiff has suffered and continues to suffer a loss in earnings and other employment benefits according to proof at time of trial.

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1 18. As a proximate result of the wrongful conduct of Defendant, Plaintiff has suffered
 2 humiliation, emotional distress and mental pain and anguish all to her damage in an amount
 3 according to proof at trial.

4 19. In doing the acts herein alleged, Defendant acted with oppression, fraud, malice,
 5 and/or conscious disregard of Plaintiff's rights and Plaintiff is therefore entitled to punitive
 6 damages.

8 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**
 9 **(Failure to Prevent Disability Discrimination in Violation of FEHA)**
 10 **(Against All Defendants)**

11 20. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference all paragraphs of this Complaint as
 12 though fully set forth herein.

13 21. Under FEHA, it is unlawful for an employer to fail to take all reasonable steps to
 14 prevent discrimination on the basis of disability.

15 22. Defendant had knowledge and/or reasonable notice of the discrimination based on
 16 disability that took place against Plaintiff and failed to prevent the same.

17 23. As a proximate result of the wrongful conduct of Defendant, Plaintiff has suffered
 18 and continues to suffer a loss in earnings and other employment benefits according to proof at time
 19 of trial.

21 24. As a proximate result of the wrongful conduct of Defendant, Plaintiff has suffered
 22 humiliation, emotional distress and mental pain and anguish all to her damage in an amount
 23 according to proof at trial.
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25 25. In doing the acts herein alleged, Defendant acted with oppression, fraud, malice,
 26 and/or conscious disregard of Plaintiff's rights and Plaintiff is therefore entitled to punitive
 27 damages.
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THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

**(Failure to Engage in the Interactive Process and Provide a Reasonable Accommodation in Violation of FEHA)
(Against All Defendants)**

26. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates all paragraphs of this Complaint as though fully set forth herein.

27. Government Code Section 12940 et seq. provides that it is unlawful for an employer to fail to engage in the interactive process and to make a reasonable accommodation for the known physical disability of an employee.

28. Defendant failed to engage in the interactive process or make a reasonable accommodation for Plaintiff's disability which it had knowledge of.

29. As a proximate result of the wrongful conduct of Defendant, Plaintiff has suffered and continues to suffer a loss in earnings and other employment benefits according to proof at time of trial.

30. As a proximate result of the wrongful conduct of Defendant, Plaintiff has suffered humiliation, emotional distress and mental pain and anguish all to her damage in an amount according to proof at trial.

31. In doing the acts herein alleged, Defendant acted with oppression, fraud, malice, and/or conscious disregard of Plaintiff's rights and Plaintiff is therefore entitled to punitive damages.

NINTH CAUSE OF ACTION

**(Failure to Provide Medical Leave in and Retaliation for Exercising the Right to Medical Leave in Violation of California Family Rights Act)
(Against All Defendants)**

32. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates all paragraphs of this Complaint as though fully set forth herein.

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40. Accordingly, the actions of Defendants, as described herein, were wrongful and in contravention of FEHA.


